Preschool and Kindergarteners:

We offer half day and full day options for this age group. Our morning program is performance based and runs from 9:00am to 12:00pm. Campers will learn about being on stage while rehearsing for our Friday performance. Our afternoon program is full of creativity and runs from 12:30pm to 3:30pm. Crafts, games and storytelling fill our time together. Our morning and afternoon programs can be combined for a full day option. Full day campers eat lunch with us from 12:00 to 12:30pm. Half day tuition is \$140. Full day tuition is \$280. Creative Kids drop in rate is \$30 per day.

1st grade through 8th grade:

Our performance based programs for this age group run from 9:00am to 3:30pm. We offer our campers the opportunity to work on a stage production. We work together throughout the week, learning about stagecraft and theater techniques, while rehearsing for our Friday performance. Campers eat lunch together from 12:00 to 12:30pm. On Friday we perform our show for family and friends. Tuition is \$280.






Participants will work on a variety of theater skills ranging from the performing arts to the backstage techniques. We will explore monologues, scene work, improvisation, theater design and stage combat!




